In March 2006, a coalition of individuals, state agencies, and nonprofits organized the inaugural "lowa Rivers Revival" (IRR) conference. The need for a statewide organization committed to river advocacy, conservation, and education was affirmed. IRR named our first River Town of the Year award recipient in 2007. We received our official nonprofit status in 2009.


## Accomplishments

The year 2022 was a year of rebuilding. We rebuilt and retooled our river cleanup program Service Squad and secured \$250,000 in new funding to host family friendly community events that impact water quality. We worked in the legislature to advocate for \$1.5 million in funding for the Dam Mitigation and Water Trails program at the IDNR.

We hosted two IDNR Toolbox
Training events with 26 total new
trainees, plus a brand new
Contractor Training that had 50
attendees complete that workshop in
partnership with ISWEP and
Impact7G. We also worked with Iowa
Confluence Water Trails (ICON) to
host their board for several floats, as
part of a new partnership between
our organizations.

We also rolled out an updated brand for IRR including everything from brochures, digital content, logo, and so much more. Same great organization, cool new look!

We hosted several river cleanup events including in Marion, Iowa and at Yeader Creek in Des Moines, as well as supported Project AWARE, an annual week-long cleanup every July.



lowa Rivers Revival (IRR) and the American Canoe Association (ACA) partnered to provide an exclusive local opportunity for twelve historically marginalized individuals from across the country to develop community leadership through paddle sports. This program is the ACA Leadership Exploration and Development Initiative (LEAD) hosted in partnership with IRR at Jester Park Nature Center in October. This one-of-a-kind experience empowered diverse leaders to go back into their communities, including as far as Florida, to better lead their members with paddle sports skills on canoes, kayaks, and paddle boards. IRR is proud to partner with a national leader in paddle sports education programming like the ACA here in Iowa.



The initiative was an all expenses paid four-day training October 20th - October 23rd. The training included ACA's Level 1: Introduction to Paddling course and their signature justice, equity, and inclusion program.

All meals, lodging, transportation, and other related program expenses were covered for these 12 leaders by a grant given to IRR by the ACA.

We hosted our first ever Legislative Lunch & Learn webinar that had over 30 new legislators attend to hear more about IRR's Policy Priorities for 2023 and educate them on river restoration, water quality, and our educational stewardship programming.

We also spent the last year filming lowa's rivers and streams in every season, and at our Toolbox Training and Service Squad river cleanup events. This culminated in our new "River-To-River" video which ICON Water Trails helped sponsor, featuring rivers from across the state.

#### Our key accomplishments in 2022 include:

- Trained 164 technical professionals to date in our Toolbox Training program
- Rolled out the new IRR brand to our members
- Helped secure \$1,500,000 for IDNR's Dams Mitigation and Water Trails program and trails projects around the state, a \$500,000 increase from last year
- Hosted a cleanup along Indian Creek in Marion, that engaged over 100+ volunteers in our first ever Clean Creek Festival

#### What's Next?

We are excited for next year as we continue to build out our Service Squad program. With the funding we've secured from Polk County, we plan to execute 8-10 river cleanups across lowa that engage and educate the public on water quality.

We will be working in schools with students to educate kids with new programming that inspires them to be to good stewards of our rivers. We will also continue to advocate at the statehouse on our boaters bill to improve boater safety and increase access points, and for good conservation practices and funding in general at the state level.
